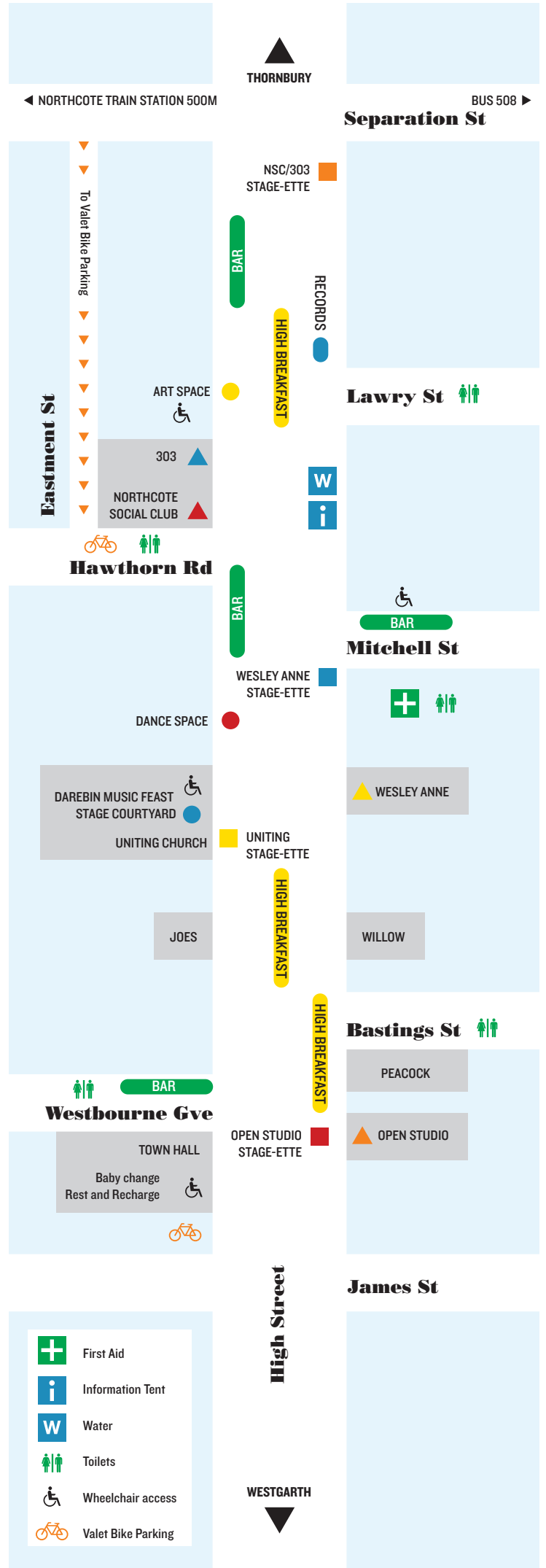


## YOUR DONATION ON ENTRY TO HIGH NOON = HEARTY MEALS FOR SOMEONE IN NEED

### LOST PROPERTY

### PUBLIC TRANSPORT

There is no disruption to Bus Service 508. There will be a temporary bus stop installed for Bus Route 567 on Prospect Grove. (at corner of Prospect Gv and Ilma Gv). Tram services on route 86 will be replaced by buses between the Clifton Hill Interchange and Dundas Street for the whole day. A replacement bus service will operate between Clifton Hill and Dundas Street diverting via Westgarth Street, Victoria Road and Darebin Road for the whole day. Trains are running their usual Sunday schedule.

### FIRST AID

### VALET BIKE PARKING

Human Powered Cycles is providing a free, secure valet bike parking service at the corner of High Street and James Street (for northbound riders) and the corner of High Street and Hawthorn Road (for southbound riders). Please avoid riding your bike through the festival site. Keep your valet bike parking docket throughout the day and bring it back to collect your bike before 7:00pm.

### TAXIS

Please be aware that taxis are not permitted within the closed Festival precinct.

## Residents and visitors of High Street Northcote

We are about to be one step closer to a safer and faster way to get on and off the number 86 tram. From October 2 - 10, Think Tram (managed by VicRoads) in partnership with Darebin City Council, the Department of Transport and Yarra Trams, are giving High Street Northcote a welcome facelift in the form of level access tram stops at two locations.

It will be noisy for a few days while the old tracks are replaced but when the dust settles they will be ready to build the new level access stops that will provide us with a lifetime of safer and quicker access to and from trams. That means improved tram travel

times and reliability because it takes less time for us to get on and off. It also means an end to checking for cars that fail to stop when you get off the tram! This is a good outcome for tram users and the community all round.

### LAYER YOUR HOMEGROWN OLIVES WITH SALT OF THE EARTH

Olives. We buy them in jars and delicatessens but for those lucky enough to have an olive tree in the backyard (or nearby park) it's time to learn how to cure these fine fruits.

Move over lemons, Peter is coming to High Noon to share his olive curing secrets. Olive curing is like a fermentation process where the natural sugars in the olives are converted into lactic acid, removing the bitter chemical compounds. There are four common ways to cure olives; natural brine, lye, salt and air.

Con (from Athens Video) hooked us up with Peter-the-extraordinary-olive-curing-guy so he can teach us a thing or two about salt curing. In simple terms; layer of olives, layer of salt, layer of olives, layer of salt.

The salt dehydrates the olives so the bitter compounds are removed. After some time the olives get rinsed and coated with olive oil (if you so choose). People add all sorts of things; spices, chilies, oregano, garlic, but Peter plans to keep his demonstration simple. The result is an olive with a similar texture to

### MANY TIMES A DAY A HERD OF 30 SKATEBOARD RIDING RHINOS TEAR DOWN HIGH STREET NORTHCOTE.

What would you do if you saw a herd of 30 rhinos racing down High Street Northcote on skateboards? You would of course get out of the way and become alert to your surroundings. With the increasing popularity of MP3 players, smartphones and all the other gadgets that are part of modern life, many pedestrians and cyclists are failing to recognise the signs that they are putting themselves in danger. Recent stats released by our friends at Yarra Trams show the number

of tram related incidents involving pedestrians and cyclists more than doubled between 2007/08 and 2009/10.

Amazingly almost 50 per cent of incidents involved a pedestrian walking into the side of a moving tram. So before crossing the road please look right, look left and look for a herd of 30 skateboard riding rhinos.
